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Programmes télévisés en direct reçus en Egypte

Résumé

Depuis 1987, des programmes de télévisions étrangères sont reçus en direct sur les petits écrans dans quelques endroits en Egypte surtout au nord du pays. L'utilisation des paraboles par le peuple égyptien revient à la fin des années quatre-vingts et les débuts des années quatre-vingt dix du dernier siècle.

L'étude du professeur SHAL examine le droit de diffusion en dehors de ses frontières en conformité avec les lois, les principes et les résolutions des Nations Unies concernant ce phénomène. A cet égard, l'étude expose les stations terriennes qui ont été utilisées pour la réception en direct (TVRO).
